## About Jawai Bera –

This region in southwestern Rajasthan, home to over 60 cave leopards in a relatively small area, offers a rare communion with the wild and a lesson in organic human-wildlife conflict management.

Halfway between Udaipur and Jodhpur, two of Rajasthan's troika of major tourist draws, lies an evocative land composed of granite hills flecked with flaming dhaak and spiny euphorbia. Close by, stretching languidly around the catchment of Luni, Rabari farmlands wound around cooled-lava hills make up the prehistoric outcrops of Jawai.

Jawai, more precisely Bera, shelters one of the highest non-forest concentrations of leopards in the world, and these spotted beings—known elsewhere assolitary and highly elusive—enjoy an unprecedentedly harmonious coexistence with the human residents of the nearby villages. Rabaris consider these graceful cave-dwellers sacred keepers of the 300 hill shrines lodged across this leopard country.



In Bera, Rajasthan, locals have lived with leopards for decades, even centuries. Bera is a small town in central Rajasthan's district of Pali, an area in the rocky Aravalli Hills fed by the Jawai River, and characterised by scrub forests. Bera's human community of around 10,000 (2011 census) inhabits the flat land, and a thriving population of leopards reside the region's rocky caves. Media reports frequently refer to it as "Leopard Country".

Bera is an anomaly: it is one of the only places (on the planet, perhaps) where leopards don't appear to be shy. "It is only in Jawai, and Sri Lanka's Yala National Park that leopards are allowing people to watch them







## Bera Legacy –

#### History timeline –

Situated in western Rajasthan, Bera, often nicknamed as "Leopard Country", is surrounded by dams and lakes, including Jawai Dam, the largest one in the entire region.

The town of Bera has a historic significance in the history of the kingdom of Mewar (Udaipur) The legendary warrior, Maharana Pratap Singh, demarcated this land for his fourth son, Rana Shekha, to rule.

Bera Nagar is an ancient city nestled in the lap of the Aravalli ranges. This region is called Godwad, which is between Marupradesh and Mewar.

Bera has a history of different eras.

## **Prehistoric And Ancient Era-**

In Rajasthan, evidence of human habitation of 1 to 4 lakh years ago has been obtained from Didwana, from the valley of Luni river of 1 lakh – 40 thousand years, and from Bagore, Tilwara, etc. From 5 – 10 thousand years ago.

The culture flourished on the banks of the Pachmatra and Banas rivers of Kalibanga (Harappan) and Mewar 5000- 3500 years ago.

The Ahar Banas culture, close to its region, was contemporary to the later period of the Indus Valley Civilization. Both these civilizations had trade relations.

This region is located to the south of the Matsya region described in the Mahabharata (about 5000 years ago). The period between Lord Neminathji and Lord Mahavira (2400 – 3000) years ago is called the Mahajanapada period.

During that period, this region was a part of the Kuru, Matsya, and Surasen Mahajanapadas at different times.

> In that period, Lord Mahavir visited this area. One of the upsarg site is the present-day Bamanwad tirth.

There is mention in the books of Jainism "नाना, दयाना, नांदया जीवति महावीर स्वामी वचिरया"

After that, the region was a part of the Nanda Dynasty and the Maurya Dynasty. After the fall of the Maurya dynasty, in the second century AD, foreign powers took control of the region. After the fall of the Shaka empire, for some time the Kushans, and later from the third century to the fifth century, the whole region remained part of the Gupta empire.

After the decline of the Gupta dynasty, foreigners adopted Hinduism and ruled till the middle of the sixth century. But the Gupta dynasty defeated them and once again took the region under their control. After the fall of the Gupta dynasty at the end of the sixth century, the whole state remained divided into small states for some time. From the middle of the sixth century to the eighth century, the Gurjara pratiharas initially took over the entire state by making Srimal the present-day Bhinmal and later Kannoj as the capital. At one time, his rule extended till Bihar.

In the ninth century, the Rashtrakutas of the south started attacking the Gurjara Pratiharas to take over the region. There were wars for a long time for supremacy in the Rashtrakutas and Gurjara Pratiharas. Gurjara Pratihara rule slowly, gradually weakened and the entire vast kingdom was divided Rashtrakuta dynasty. He was a Jain religionist. He is compared to Chandragupta Maurya. His descendant and a Rashtrakuta Samanta Hari Verma took over Hathundi (Ratamahaveer Ji Bijapur) in 880 AD. At that time, the entire area including the fleet came under his control.

At the end of the third century, Shrestha Virdev created and Acharya Sidhesen Surishwarji built, the present temple of Lord Mahavira. This is mentioned in the history (Purvadha) of the tradition of Parshvanath Bhagwan. This temple is around 1700 years old

## Medieval Era -

Emperor Prithviraj Chauhan declared himself independent king in 917 AD. His second son, Laxman Singh, came to Nadula present Nadol in 950 AD and took advantage of the chaos of the rule of the Paramara kings in the region, and declared himself an independent ruler. In this way, the Rashtrakutas of Hathundi and Chauhan of Nadol became neighboring rulers.

Mohammed Ghaznavi, who was going to attack Somnath in 1024 AD, was defeated by Rampal of Nadol and Dutt Varma, the ruler of Hathundi. Ghaznavi destroyed and devastated cities like Nadol, Hathundi, etc., and temples.

In 1175 AD, Sinhaji, the ruler of Hathundi (Rata Mahavirji), was defeated by Chauhan Samant Varsingh of his Bali fort and took possession of 42 villages in the region.

He built his new capital, the new fort fleet Bera Bujri 1, which is currently in ruins in front of the village of Verdi Kakradi. At the same time, a Jain temple was built there, which was worshiped by Lord Adeshwarji. But in no time brought his capital to the Bera Bujri 2, the present juna Bera Bujri.

> A Jain temple was also built here. Whose Appraiser Lord Dada Parshwanath

Around 1545 AD, the relocation of the old Bera started to new Bera. With this, construction of the current Sambhavnathji Jain temple, Shri Ram temple and Rawale also started.

Both these temples were honored on the same day in the Vikrami calendar, is a historical calendar used in the Indian subcontinent. Vikram Samvat is generally 57 years ahead of Gregorian Calendar, except during January to April, when it is ahead by 56 years.1612 (AD 1554) by Akbar's proponent Acharya Harivijaya Suri .

Harivijaya Suri was the supreme pontiff of Tapa Gachcha order of Jain Svetambara tradition.In 1582, Emperor Akbar invited Hiravijaya Suri to explain him the principals of Jainism. Akbar was so impressed with Hiravijaya Suri that he bestowed on him the title of Jagatguru..

Gradually, the old Bera became desolate and people started living in the new Bera. Gradually, the work of the present Rawale was also completed.

Around 1580 AD (1638) Maharana Pratap of Mewar gave the Jagir to his fourth son Shekhaji. The present Thakursaheb is his descendant.

## Modern Era-

Later the jagir of the Bera became Marwar (Jodhpur) state from Mewar state under matrimonial relations.

After the First War of Independence of 1857, the Jagir of the Bera became under the British Empire under the Marwar (Jodhpur) kingdom. Till this time the main occupation of the people was agriculture and animal husbandry. People used to do their business according to the varna system.

Thakur Shivnath Singhji of Bera was the son also the Chief Secretary of Maharaja Ummed Singhji of Jodhpur.

His son Thakur Prithvi Singhji was a famous polo player. In his command, the army of Jodhpur bravely won many difficult wars in the First World War in Jordan, Egypt, Gaza region.

1960's – Thakur Jangjeet Singh Bera was into farming and owned and managed one of the largest and the most efficient farm in Rajasthan . 5000 acres of land and professional farming , he was the first one to get into hybrid farming and tied up with the Rockefeller foundation .

In 2000 – Castle Bera opened its gates to Travellers and Thakur Baljeet Singh started entertaining guests from all over the world .

## Tourist attraction -

#### Jawai Bandh-

Built across the Jawai river which is a tributary of Luni, the dam offers an exquisite view of the river.

Its construction was started on 12 May 1946 and was finished in 1957. It is the biggest dam in western Rajasthan with the total area of 102,315 acres. Its height is 61.25 feet (18.67 meters) and the capacity is 7887.5 million cubic feet.It a perfect site to watch the magnificent river and also wildlife around it.

You can easily spot crocodiles and birds from the dam and the level of water makes the whole environment perfect for an outing. It is one of the vantage points in Jawai from where you can watch the entire village. The dream-like vista you get from here is precious in its nature.

# Indian Leopards-

Leopards are undoubtedly the biggest attraction in this area. The most fascinating part is that they are very familiar with the locals and there hasn't been a single incident of leopard attack in the villages nearby. The people have also reciprocated this behavior by keeping the habitat of big cats uninterrupted. It is a swashbuckling experience to watch them roam around freely.

The behavior of Jawai leopards is much talked about because they live very close to the human settlement and are surprisingly friendly with them. They attack only the wild animals at night and do not even try to prey on the cattle reared by the locals. And that's why, it is very easy to watch them even at the daytime and they have never attacked any human being ever.

### Crocodile-

The confluence of a river and thousands of birds also make this place haven for crocodiles. They are often seen basking and hunting on the river banks. They can be easily cited from the dam and become one of the central attractions.

Even if you have seen a crocodile in the Zoo, it is a different experien ce to watch them bask in their natural habitat. Especially when they go back to water to resume hunting, their hide is noticeable when they rest at the shore of the river.

Birds -

Jawai gives you a great experience of bird-watching. Between the month of October and March, it becomes a temporary home shelter for migratory birds. You can see a great variety of birds including barheaded geese, sarus cranes, common eastern crane, knob-billed duck, demmossile, spotbill duck, and flamingos.With such a great variety of birds, Jawai is surely a paradise for bird-watchers.

There are various birds and you get a perfect environment with river and other animals. It is amazing to watch migratory birds and there are so many here to surprise you.

Here, you can easily become a passionate wildlife lover and enthusiast.

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# Jawai Hills-

The granite hills of Jawai were formed millions of years ago by Lava and they are home to many wild animals as well.

They are not steep and that makes trekking very easy. Apart from visiting the temple, one can also rove around the rocks and feel the wilderness inside. It is an indispensable part of the panorama of Jawai.

The best thing about Jawai Hills is that they are not abandoned, they are a shelter to animals and humans as well. And they become a perfect for photography, you can get the view of the entire village from here.

These rocks give you a feeling of solitude and also bring you closer to nature with a profound charm.

September and October: Warm weather throughout the day. Average temperature range is between 18 degrees Celsius to a maximum day temperature of 30 degrees Celsius with medium humidity.

November to February: Expect cold temperatures in the mornings and evenings with a warm sun in the daytime. Average temperature range is between 4 degrees Celsius to a maximum day temperature of 24 degrees Celsius.

March and April: Whilst the early mornings and late evenings are cool the weather during these months is warm, with high temperatures in the daytime. Average temperature range is between 12 degrees Celsius to a maximum day temperature of 40 degrees Celsius in a very dry climate

### **BERA JACKETS -**

At the age of 22 he started "Bera Jackets" his own Brand of clothing and since then he has not looked back . With a mission to promote the local arts and crafts of the area to increase employment and to revive the art of quilting under the brand name of Bera jackets .

Bera jackets where first introduced in the 1920's by Captain Thakur Prithi Singh Bera , who was a world class polo player and grandson of the great Sir Pratap Singh Jodhpur , Maharajah of Idar . He was also part of the legendary Jodhpur team which won all over the world . Thakur Prithi Singh Bera was a man of style and in those days the tailors of Bera were known for the art of quilting, that was initially done for the polo horses . He ordered his personal royal tailors to make quilted jackets & Phulgaar for him and that's how it all began .

The trend picked up and The Bera Phulgaar's and jackets were ordered by a lot of royals and were also presented to international personal guests of the royalties.

But Thakur Prithi singh passed away at a young age of 35 and so the art faded away.

Thakur Baljeet Singh Bera and Uncle Thakur Devi Singh Bera were the pioneers of Leopards safaris in Jawai , there was a time no one believed that there were leopards in Bera Jawai , but after 20 years of hardwork and dedication both the brothers got Bera Jawai on the world map & has given employment and business opportunities to hundreds of locals .




### I-CLEAN JAWAI –

Surprisingly, humans are not the only visitors here, the temple is also visited by leopards and other wild animals in the area.


At the very first sight, the temple gives you goosebumps because it is located in the middle of rocks and you might even find some leopards or other animals roaming around. The tracks are made up of the same granite the entire temple is a monolith. It is a mesmerising experience to witness the temple at such a height.

### Kambeshwar Mahadev Temple-

Kambeshwar Mahadev Temple is located in the Sheoganj area of Sumerpur Tehsil. It is only 11 km far from Jawai Bandh and a must-see for people who touring this belt. Apart from the devotees, it also becomes a go-to destination for thrill seekers as the temple is situated in the hills and you have to reach there through the serpentine roads carved out of hills.In the month of November, the annual fair is organized at this temple.

This one-day event attracts a humongous crowd from neighboring towns suchas Sirohi, Pali, and Jalor.

It is quite a spectacle to watch and those who are planning to visit Jawai must involve a day for this occasion in their itinerary. Even if you are not religious, you cannot help but praise this place.



### Abhinav Mahavir Dham-

Shree Abhinav Mahavir Dham is a shrine located in the city of Sumerpur, Rajasthan in the middle beautiful hills. It is a beautiful structure which is also very easy to reach because of its vicinity to NH 14. It is only 8 km from Jawai Bandh and a must-see place for those who want to explore the region. The temple structure is wonderful and the boarding facilities are also excellent. The temple gives you an insight of Jainism and shows us how culture has thrived in the country.



We will take you among them and give you an insight into their lifestyle. It would be an excursion of a lifetime for you and ethereal experience that you won't be able to forget.


